Medicines are not the major driver of hospital spending increases

Increased spending on medicines accounted for just 10% of total hospital spending growth between 2015 and 2017



WHAT ACTUALLY HAPPENS

- In 2017, the US spent \$108.1 billion more on hospital care than in 2015.2
- In 2017, hospitals spent \$11.1 billion more on inpatient and outpatient drugs than in 2015.

Increased drug expenses explain at most 10% of the growth in hospital spending observed between 2015 and 2017

The annual spending for the average US hospital grew by \$17.6 million between 2015 and 2017, with drug expenses increasing by \$1.8 million³

METHODS

- Total drug expenses was calculated by multiplying the number of US hospitals in 2017 (6,120)4 and the average increase in drug spending per hospital (\$1.8 million).1 \$11.1 billion is approximately 10% of the \$108.1 billion increase in hospital care spending.2
- Total hospital spending calculated by dividing the total increase in hospital care spending between 2015 and 2017 (\$108.1 billion) by the number of US hospitals in 2017 (6,120).4
